#### **Continuing the Promise:**

CCM was established in 1981 to help families overcome financial crisis related to the cyclical nature of the textile industry. Needs changed dramatically in 2003 with the closing of the textile mill and a shifting of the local economic landscape. The changing nature of crisis from "short-term" to "chronic" required a change in the services responding to crisis. Since that time, CCM has doubled its impact in the community to include serving families facing homelessness and housing crisis.

## **Stories of Hope**



Professionally she had arrived. This job could actually pay the bills for Sheila and her three children, if only she could gain some semblance of control from the chaos of financial crisis. There was seemingly no way to get ahead of the penalties that kept setting her back. Her church guided her to CCM's online housing application to seek relief and recovery. The day she and her children moved into *My Father's House* the chaos stopped, finally she could breathe, she could think without desperation, she would utilize services to guide her decisions and stop the cycle of loss. For Sheila, 2017 was the year when the *impossible became possible*.

A school teacher and mother of two; Carrie was drowning under a monthly rent of \$825 per month and only weeks away from no place to go. A coworker told her of CCM's housing services and for the first time in forever; there was hope. Her first night in the *Mothers & Children program* was filled with both anxiety and relief. She did not know where this would lead, but she knew it was the *beginning of a better future*.


