


Seven Sector Accessibility

The Challenge in Cabarrus County

1 in 8 people living in poverty

1 in 6 children living in poverty

1 in 5 children face food insecurity

Through Sept. 103 evictions per month Through Sept. **36 foreclosures** per month

537 homeless students in 2017/18 school year **40%** of homeless children are **preschoolers** net over 800 homeless children

Fair Market Rent \$967 for 2BR is more expensive than 94% of NC increasing at 6.6% year-over-year *****

At \$14/hour and 40 hours/week a family can support approx. \$700 a month in housing costs. (rent + utilities)


