

SCHOLARSHIP FOR SENIOR LIVING AT GRACE PLACE



The Ms. Corine Cannon Scholarship for Residential Assisted and Independent Living, a special scholarship to help seniors access assisted living at *Grace Place* @ Caremoor, continues to grow as folks learn of this unique opportunity to support a vulnerable population here in our community. This initiative is named in honor of Ms. Corine Cannon, a dedicated advocate for our community.

Ms. Cannon, who has long supported the residents of Cabarrus County, saw a need for better access to assisted living for

retirees and advocated for a solution.

Ed Hosack, CCM's CEO, expressed his excitement about this initiative, stating, "This scholarship will help more people access the quality care they deserve, supporting our commitment to serving vulnerable seniors in our community."

Currently, the scholarship fund has \$74,500, and CCM's goal is to reach \$105,000 in honor of Ms. Cannon's 105th birthday! If you'd like to contribute, you can donate at CooperativeMinistry.com.

2025: WE NEED A BREAKTHROUGH

According to the North Carolina Housing Coalition twenty-seven percent of Cabarrus households are **cost burdened**, for many of them their cost of housing leaves them with **not enough** to cover the current high cost of all other necessary household expenses, like food, clothing, transportation, medical, education, and other important items. (27% = 20,341 households)

Homelessness and Housing Crisis is affecting an increasing number of people in our community. CCM has initiated a breakthrough housing solution to help individuals and families recover from financial struggle and regain stability.

WE NEED YOUR HELP to create *Grace Place* @ Caremoor and The Rebuilders Campus. The hard truth is that 3 out of 10 of our neighbors are too cost burdened to help. A few of our neighbors are helping with significantly large gifts.

OUR GOAL is for 1 out of 10 of the remaining Cabarrus County households, businesses and churches to contribute a promise level gift of \$1,200. In doing so, we will raise \$10 million to establish a real solution for homelessness and housing crisis in our community.

Parents cannot support the dynamics to nurture family life or participation in community. Without stable housing there is no rehabilitation and no recovery.

2024 CHRISTMAS ASSISTANCE PROGRAM RECAP

Thanks to the incredible generosity of our community, this year's Christmas Assistance Programs were a success!

Senior Care & Share Shoebox Program: We received 199 shoe boxes and gift bags filled with thoughtful items. 164 were distributed to Meals on Wheels shut-ins, and 35 went to Caremoor residents, delivered by Pam Smith, CCM's Director of Partner engagement.





Adopt a Family for Christmas Program: All 121 applications, including those from

our housing clients, were matched with sponsors from local businesses, churches, and individuals. Families also received toys from the Cannon YMCA Toy Closet, and gift cards donated by the community. Additional support came from the Salvation Army, Shop with a Cop, Boys & Girls Club, and Target Kids.
