# **OUT OF THE RUBBLE...**

"Out of the rubble of past lives to build anew." - Isaiah 58:12 (MSG)

HOMELESSNESS has attracted national attention as close as Asheville, North Carolina and has become

newsworthy in nearby Charlotte. The disruption of lives and the loss of potential is escalating here in Cabarrus County.

Families with children are the largest demographic of homeless in Cabarrus County. Our school counselors are identifying hundreds of students in this new school year who qualify for services through the McKinney-Vento Act for homeless students. Many more preschool-age children are included in these families who are living in hotels and other compromised environments across our community. Local indicators identify more than half of the homeless in Cabarrus County are children.

Cooperative Christian Ministry is partnering with the Cabarrus Community to provide immediate and long-term solutions to meet households in housing crisis and deliver resources and training for families to move out of crisis.

CCM's Path to Stability housing model is providing safety and producing stability for dozens of households, (60 to 80% of these households are headed by single mothers). Unfortunately, CCM's programs are meeting only 10% of the needs documented through applications for housing.

In June of 2023, CCM purchased the 10.5 acre Brown Mill property on Cabarrus Avenue in Concord. The site will become home to *The Rebuilders Campus at Brown Mill Commons*.

#### OUT OF THE RUBBLE! CONT.

Phase One of CCM's plan for new transitional housing capacity will open in 2026 to host *The Rebuilders College*, a program designed with CCM's *Path to Stability* transitional housing model. The Rebuilders Campus represents our community's **Window of Opportunity** to address the conditions and causes that are at the root of the housing crisis.

The Rebuilders Campus will be a place where:

- > Parents and children will feel safe.
- Families will find the margin to REBUILD their finances.
- They will find structure and stability to REPAIR relationships
- And a sense of community to RESTORE hope.

#### **Help Us House Them!**

CCM is continuing to look for added capacity in our Housing Program to replace recent changes, and we have found a partner at Memorial Baptist Church (MBC). With the help of local contractors and volunteers from MBC and Atrium Health, we are working to renovate a building provided by the church to replace 4 to 5 client rooms formerly provided at My Father's House in Concord. We hope to commission the facility in October as the My Father's House Annex, or The Annex, providing transitional housing support for families in crisis.

Education and Support Services (ESS) recently held a financial literacy workshop, "Bank On Your Success," in partnership with Truist Bank and the City of Concord Housing Department.

The workshop, which is part of our Pathway to Progress series, was facilitated by Nancy St. Jacobs, Vice-President / Multicultural Banking Leader/Truist for NC and Virginia West.

Ms. St. Jacobs provided participants with practical knowledge, skills-building opportunities, and resources they can use to manage their finances with confidence. With an emphasis on real life skills and choices, the program conceptualized financial literacy as more than just knowledge and skills, it helped participants recognize that attitudes and behavioral factors are equally critical for individuals to engage successfully in sound financial decision making. Ms. St. Jacobs emphasized that "multicultural baking is actually what banking on your success is. Truist's purpose is to inspire and build better lives and communities."
